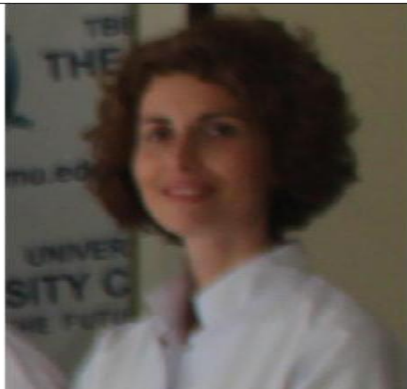

The gynecological department was established in 1919, at the university's medical faculty. The head of the department was Professor Ivan Tikanadze (1919-1943). Since 1943 to 1954 the head of this department was professor Platon Shushania.

In 1920 was established first Gynecological department. Head of this department was Gabriel Gambarashvili (1920-1954). In 1954, by merging this two departments, was established department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, and head of this department was professor Platon Shushania, up to 1970.

In 1971-83 head of OB-GYN department was Michael Gigineishvili, in 1983-94 the head of the same department was his son, professor Michael Gigineishvili jr. 1994-2006 professor Jemal Metreveli, since 2006 chairman of OB-GYN department is professor Nickolas Kintraia.

TSMU staff of OB-GYN department are developing several scientific projects, such as:

1. Role of Immunological factors in pathogenesis of Preeclampsia.
2. Stress and Pregnancy.
3. Influence of the surgery, performed during pregnancy, on the fetus development.
4. Laparoscopic approach to the Gynecological surgery in obese patients.

TSMU OB-GYN department is actively collaborating with international Donor organizations, such as: USAID, UNICEF, JSI and UNFPN and participates in projects developed by these organizations in Georgia.

In collaboration with WHO OB-GYN department has developed new curriculum and teaching methodology of OB-GYN for medical students and professors/teachers.
